

Sentence Diagramming: Compound Sentences

When you diagram a compound sentence, you diagram each sentence and connect the two with a dotted line with the conjunction written on a parallel line.

Example: I ran to the library but it was closed.

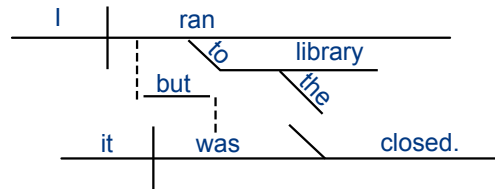
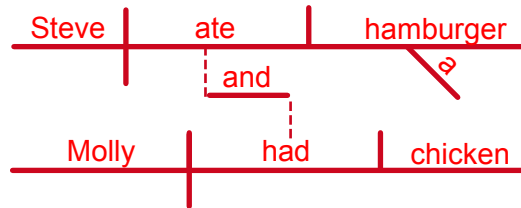
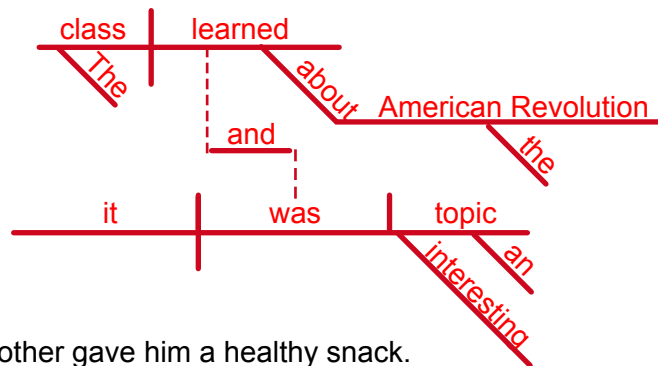


Diagram each sentence below.

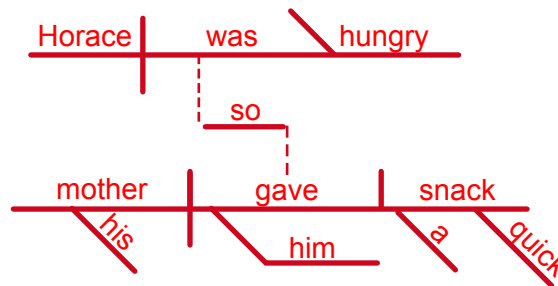
1. Steve ate a hamburger, and Molly had chicken.
